Make sure you are entering good notes in the field as well. Putting the minimum 4 characters into the field is not going to cut it if you are stopped by an officer.

When in doubt, always ask or just use your drive time. PC can be considered a falsification and can not only lead to troubles with DOT, but also attorneys if something were to happen.

I bring this up because a driver was just issued 2 violations for using PC. I was able to get one DataQ'ed but the major takeaway was if you have drive time to use, use it.

Just like my dad told me about driving when I was 16... PC is a privilege and not a right. It can and will be taken away for misuse.
